## Advertising agencies pick up work from Super Bowl event, Sam Fox, copper mine

Local advertising and public relations agencies have picked up some new accounts led by the Phoenix-based Aritgue Agency grabbing work for a Super Bowl-related food and wine event.

Ray Artigue's agency will handling marketing for Taste of the NFL, a pre-Super Bowl event being held in Scottsdale on Jan. 31. The charity event raises money for food banks via a food and wine festival featuring notable chefs.
